



#### Competition format.

1. The title is awarded each year at a pre-nominated Cross Country Walton Chasers event.
2. The title is awarded in each age division M & W
3. It is open to anyone eligible to compete at the particular event.
4. To be eligible you must run the long course defined by your age class.
  - a) At a WMOA league this is the same course as that competition
  - b) At other events it is the course defined in the BOF Guideline B
5. The winner in each age class is the person with the lowest minutes / km
6. The title Chase ace is held by the winner until someone achieves a lower minutes / km at a future event.
7. The holder does not need to defend their title and can retain it without competing at the following years event.
8. If the class winner sets a new fastest time they get a "Title Holder" certificate. If they are the fastest on the day but do not beat the record they get a "certificate of Merit"
9. A table for the Chase Ace winners is maintained on the club web site.
10. The title holder still retains the title when they move up a year group. (It is therefore possible that a very good orienteer could through their lifetime win and retain the title in every age class)
11. At future events the target time to beat the current record will be published for each course.
